Our mandate is to saturate the state of Florida with Green, multiplying microchurches in all 67 counties. To do this, we recognize that every plan and movement forward must be bathed in intentional prayer. Connection with God is vital to success in all we do, and daily posturing of ourselves at His feet will continue to be a priority Movement-wide.

Our vision is to be a sending church and a missions outpost, made up of people who sacrificially love their neighbor both locally and globally - a place where ordinary people fall in love with Jesus and are mobilized to change the world. One of our deepest desires is to see every single people group on Earth have access to the gospel. It is for this joy and Jesus' glory that we are committed to sending our best to plant churches and make disciples among the 42 percent of the world that still live with limited or no gospel access.

In 2023, local neighborhoods were changed, educational inequalities in our schools were addressed, trafficked children were rescued, vulnerable women in our city were restored, gang violence was pushed back, displaced refugees were cared for, justice was enacted, and churches were planted in places that for thousands of years have existed without gospel access.


In 2023 we gave over 48 percent of everything spent to missions, church planting and the poor. For the Big Give in the fall, we gave \$860,000 to Missionary Sam and Life for the Innocent and 593 children were restored out of human trafficking. Six disciples from our own church served on the global mission field - the majority of them in unreached nations - and we supported over 140 missionaries and ministries monthly throughout the world. As we look back, we stand in awe of the prayers declared over closed nations, tears wept for the persecuted and vulnerable, dollars given, people sent, foreigners welcomed, and prisoners loved. Through the power of Jesus and the generosity of our church body, statistics and lives were changed.

May our prayers for this coming year align with the words of John Stott: "We must be global Christians with a global vision because our God is a global God." May we joyfully give and reorient everything to make disciples who make disciples near, far, and to the ends of the earth.


2023 MISSIONS MAP

NEIGHBORHOOD AND COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

In 2023, we were once again amazed at how our church body stepped up to meet the needs of our local community. Amid a challenging economy, you lived out the words of Jesus' teaching in Matthew 25:40 by caring for the least of these in our city through your time and generosity. Thank you for reflecting God's love for the most vulnerable, especially at a period when needs are at an all-time high.



CARVER GARDENS

It is not uncommon for students to show up during the first couple of weeks of school not having the necessary materials. In 2023, 140 local students were equipped for the school year, exceeding all our previous back-to-school drives. Additional schools and community partners also benefitted from the surplus of your generosity. This was not only a source of joy in equipping students but also of gratitude and blessing as the financial burden was relieved from families. Thank you for helping equip and support these students and families.

PINERIDGE

Our team connected with eight new families in our Pineridge Community this year. It's been a joy to see our volunteers building these new relationships. One volunteer forged a close relationship with one of the families and was able to come alongside and support them as they experienced the sudden loss of an immediate family member. Instances like these remind us so much of why we do what we do.

This year we also hosted three community events, including a water day, a neighborhood picnic, and



a field trip to the movies to escape the summer heat. These events are great opportunities to deepen connections with our neighbors and enjoy our community. 2023 also marked our third annual theme-park trip for our middle schoolers, a day we cherish as an opportunity to celebrate and encourage these students.

We also welcomed one new neighborhood resident to our team, Erica Goodson. She and her husband, Connor Goodson, are part two of our team that lives in Pineridge full-time.





HOLLY HEIGHTS

In 2023, Jennifer and Brent Godshalk expanded their ministry in the Holly Heights neighborhood. In collaboration with the Bread of the Mighty Food Bank, they deliver around 600 pounds of food to 12 to 13 individuals and families every week. Their focus is on nurturing and building personal relationships with often-overlooked demographics in our community, including working poor families, disabled and elderly individuals, shut-ins, and disabled veterans, showing the tangible love of Christ in a practical way.

Beyond physical assistance, Jennifer and Brent are delighted to have ongoing relationships with each middle school and high school student still living in Holly Heights, whom they first met years ago through Greenhouse's outdoor Kids Church. They share life with these families- from celebrating new babies to mourning spouses who have passed, consoling during medical crises, mutually sharing prayer requests, and engaging in precious conversations about our Lord and His Love.

SCHOOL PARTNERSHIPS AND TUTORING

Throughout the year, Greenhouse comes alongside our several school partnerships by providing staffing for mentorship programs, consistent volunteers, sponsoring enrichment activities, and supporting school staff. In 2023, a local elementary school's safety patrols of over 15 students had the opportunity to broaden their horizons by experiencing a trip to Washington, D.C. through your generous sponsorships. Read below to see how you helped us impact our Carver and Pinerdige Communities.

CARVER GARDENS

Last year we experienced some firsts in our Carver Gardens Community Tutoring Program's 10-plus years of existence. The program operated from its own leased classroom space! Previously, our space was shared with other programs. By having our own space, students are now able to dream and make it their own. They gave us ideas of what they wanted the space to look like, and a few weeks later those ideas were implemented and revealed to the students.

When asked why this space was important, one student responded, "For us to be happy and have a safe space." A sense of ownership, a positive environment, and an innovative classroom improve academic performance. We've seen this firsthand as our students are inspired and engaged in the new classroom.

Additionally, for the first time in over five years, all but one student remained in our tutoring roster into the new school year. Due to different challenges and a transient community, we typically lose students who relocate following the school year. We're grateful for the consistency the remaining students have experienced through the program.

PINERIDGE

In 2023 we doubled the size of our Pineridge tutoring team to include 10 volunteers! This allowed us to achieve a 1:1 ratio of tutors to students-something we've been working towards for years. We also expanded our weekly program to utilize a second apartment due to the increased number of students and tutors. This extra space and our 1:1 ratio meant that our students received the individual attention they needed in a comfortable space to learn and grow!


This year also marked our first time hosting two new trainings for our volunteers, one focused on TBRI (Trust Based Relational Intervention) and another for the UFLI program (a UF-developed literacy program). These trainings equipped our volunteers to better create safe spaces for our students from hard places and help them close educational gaps in critical areas for future success.

We saw one of our highest participation rates in our Discipleship Training, dozens of new microchurches launched, more microchurches planted in new counties than ever before in a calendar year, and a massive resurgence of multiplications. With new coaching structures being developed and rolled out, new training microchurches, and pop-up microchurches being unveiled, the microchurch engine is picking up speed and building momentum moving into 2024. This is going to be a year of continued growth and development for our microchurch influence and reach!

2023 was Greenhouse Jacksonville's second year in existence and first full year as a church. This year, we've seen substantial growth across every area of observation. Attendance and Microchurch involvement nearly doubled, with multiplications taking place and more to follow, and we had our first baptisms. The Lord did all these things despite the fact that we were only in our main venue at the University of North Florida 35 Sundays out of the year. With an average of one Sunday per month where we had to pivot venues, the buy-in of our existing church, partnered with their dedication to discipleship, didn't just allow us to survive, but thrive.

As we kick off 2024, we are doing so with expectation and joy. We already cleared our largest hurdle - a new venue located at Sandalwood High School - that will provide more consistency and will allow us to meet 52 Sundays per year. We have access to amazing facilities for our main service, kids of all ages, and a Next Steps area. Additionally, we have been shown favor with the principal and administration, as they have provided access to the faculty, inroads with the students and have even given us a substantial discounted rate. Truly God has exceeded our expectations in every way!

While this open door has been such an answer to prayer, the main prayer remains the same: That ordinary people would become passionate followers of Jesus. This year, our church partners have said yes to the call of God in some beautiful ways. From opening homes as foster parents and reorienting business plans to be radically generous, to strategically moving family in order to live closer to areas of ministry, ordinary people are becoming passionate followers of Jesus.

Our prayer for 2024 is that we'd continue to see the Lord move in our midst while we gain the stability of being planted. Not stuck, not stopping, but stable in a way that will allow us to cast a wider net with stronger follow-ups. As we plant ourselves in the Sandalwood community, we are believing that we will

continue to see every nation, ever tribe and ever tongue call on the name of the Lord and become passionate followers of Jesus.

God answered our prayer to find a place where we can make an immediate impact, a hub centrally located to serve communities across three counties, and a location that is accessible to both UT and USF students.

Starting March 24, 2024, Greenhouse Church is officially coming home to Tampa Heights Elementary. Let the coundown begin! We have been sent. We are grateful for all God has done, and we look forward to all He will do in 2024.

As we sought the Lord for 2023, we sensed two clear directives: to reach our community by mobilzing our church, and to bathe and saturate everything in prayer.

And finally, we celebrated with all of heaven as many of these same visitors had radical encounters with Jesus, surrendering to His lordship and going "All In" through baptism! All of this happened as a result of God's grace stirring up our church family - mobilizing us with His love, power and boldness - to reach our community.

Internationally, we watched as God continued His great work in Greenhouse Guyana, moving them into more in-person gatherings and discipleship both at their Guyana space, as well as in microchurch and discipleship meetings throughout the city. And we marveled as our church family gave more to missions than ever before in the history of our church!



There is absolutely no avenue or space that the gospel can not infiltrate. There is so much darkness online. However, that's just where the gospel specializes in being a light. Church Online is more than a video stream. It is a real, powerful expression of church for many online engagers, including thosel traveling for work, those who cannot find a similar church in their area, and even those who are in regions where the gospel is illegal. Our motto has become, "This is not just a live stream. We are a family."

In 2023, we connected 150 online engagers into our Discipleship Pathway. We reached over 2,400 people per week. We averaged 325 comments across all of our platforms Sunday mornings. We doubled the amount of people we prayed for on our live streams to an average of 12 per week during our online alter call. Our volunteer base has grown to 12 people. And we added over 2,000 people to our Youtube subscription, recently hitting the 7,000 subscriber mark.

Even though these numbers are powerful, there is nothing more exciting than the testimonies coming from our engagers. Patricia, who had been watching online for about a year, decided to meet with our staff in person and is not connected in our church. Tony Do, who has been bedridden with cancer, engaged with us while walking through chemo in his hospital room. Tony has since defeated cancer and is now attending Greenhouse Church in person. These are just a couple examples from stories and proof of cancer shrinking, cysts drying up, bones healed, marriages restored, and anxiety being removed.

2024 is going to be an exciting year as we intend to reach more people online, double our volunteer base, connect more people into microchurches, develop stronger systems, and find creative solutions for making our online experience more interactive.

"I finally feel like I belong somewhere," said Tim, a church online volunteer. "I never thought liking computers would serve a purpose in the church."

In the book of Acts, the early church demonstrated a lifestyle of prayer and missions in the context of local church life. The centerpiece of their activity was prayer, and the outflow was a strong community and mission. We have received a clear mandate from the Lord to be a presence-centered and prayer-based church that ministers to Jesus in the "first love" reality, walks humbly, and sees the kingdom of God advance as we stay committed to the Great Commission.

D.L. Moody once said, "Every great movement of God can be traced to a kneeling figure." Every great move of God in the Bible and throughout Church history has been preceded by a praying people. We as a faith family remain committed to revival God's way - on our knees. This past year, we have seen our prayer momentum continue to grow as we intentionally continued to commit to bathing all we do in prayer.

In 2023, 146 people joined our Volunteer Prayer Team to pray over the Greenhouse ministries every week. Every hour of every day someone is intentionally praying for Greenhouse. Our 24/7 Prayer Team consists of 74 people who have committed to this endeavor. 99 people have joined our 67 Counties Prayer Team. People living in 17 different Florida counties join us to pray over their counties. There are 20 additional counties that people have agreed to pray for. Every Sunday, our Intercessors meet to intercede for the service and for those who attend in person and online. We have continuous prayer from 8am-1:30pm in the Freedom Prayer Room and from 4-5pm at the University Auditorium every Sunday. Every Tuesday and Wednesday at 8am and 12pm noon we have individual prayer and live worship. Every Wednesday night, we have prayer and worship from 7-8:30pm. Participation steadily increases, and lives change as people encounter the Lord.

Our rallying cry as a faith family is, "Until we connect with God, everything else is a distraction." Partner with us as we continue to build a house of prayer that fuels all of our Kingdom activity from Gainesville to the nations.

This year, our Worship team embraced a profound commitment to prayer, collaborating with the Lord to establish a dedicated House of Prayer. This included the successful launch and sustained operation of five additional prayer sets on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. We also nurtured the growth of more than 15 devotional worship leaders, organized quarterly team nights to prioritize the collective well-being and team culture, and introduced a Vision and Values "Culture Code" to align our worship team with a singular vision and core values.

Throughout the year, we implemented live auditions, revamped our onboarding system, and led worship at various church retreats like Breakthrough Weekend, Greenhouse Conference, Kids Camp, Launch Camp, Kairos, and College Weekend.

Inspired by a deep exploration of the Theology of Worship through scripture with Pastor Oscar, we experienced a surge in writing new, Christ-centered original songs. This includes the introduction of four new originals in our Sunday corporate worship spaces along with several others during our mid-week devotional sets.

To better support and guide our volunteers, we welcomed a new worship administrative assistant, established a Leadership Core Team, and organized our inaugural Worship Staff Retreat, fostering growth both together and in the Lord. Additionally, we curated two special nights of worship - Juneteenth Night of Worship and our inaugural Night of Jubilee, a six-hour worship event on New Year's Eve to usher in the new year with our focus on Jesus.

It's humbling to witness God's movement in our ministry, and we are grateful for the opportunity to partner with Him. We navigated deeper spiritual waters, engaged in challenging conversations, and surrendered every plan to Him. As we step into 2024, we eagerly anticipate the unfolding of new opportunities and blessings from God, building on the foundation of prayer, growth, and inspiration laid out in 2023.

We love making disciples of the youngest ones of our church! In 2023 we created five new Greenhouse Kids original series that followed alongside the topics being preached to our adults. This included fun video teachings, interactive games and activities, and take home crafts. Alongside our Sunday curriculum, we officially launched our Family Bible Initiative, devotionals for kids 3 years old to 5th grade. Over 35 kids read through the book of Genesis and Matthew.

We hosted our second Kids Camp in 2023, where we had 168 children attend. Kids got a chance to operate in each APEST gift through interactive and fun activities like sports, cooking and baking, art, acting and STEM. We ended the week with a Family Service to celebrate all God did through our amazing Kids.

This summer we had our first Family Missions Trip to Jordan. This was a 10-day trip to Jordan. It was so amazing to meet and learn from missionaries who are thriving as they obediently live out the Great Commission and reach those who have no access to the Gospel.

In the Fall, we hosted the Kids Greenhouse Conference, where 49 Kids learned how to be Salt and Light to the world. Kids participated in the main worship session with adults, gathered in large group for teachings, and had fun baking cookies...that is until we told them they forgot the salt and had to throw them away! (Just like in Matthew 5). But don't worry, we made some more and included the salt.

Kids are hungry for God. They are excited to discover their gifts and to use them. So on Sundays, we launched Kids Serve teams where children can serve in worship, hospitality, prayer, and student leader teams. Our 2nd and 3rd grade girls even launched a Kids Microchurch that meets outside of Sundays! This sparked ideas in other kids to start microchurches in 2024! We are excited and expectant for this upcoming year, and ready to watch even more children become passionate followers of Jesus.

There are about 19,000 children in foster care throughout the state of Florida. These vulnerable children stand to gain the most when local churches step up to provide support via resources, volunteers, and families. Additionally, their biological families in crisis will gain strength through relational support. We want to be the kind of church that steps up for vulnerable children.

In 2023, we had 26 families in our church say yes to children in foster care. They welcomed children into their homes, cared for them, loved them, and were the hands and feet of Jesus day and night. In May, we hosted the Hope for the Journey Conference as a resource to help individuals grow in knowledge, understanding, and to be equipped with practical tools to help support children, parents, and families in this community. We had 99 attendees for this powerful weekend. In May and November, we had two Sundays dedicated to our FAM families, honoring, celebrating, and praying for them in services. These have been such sweet and powerful moments.

In our Kids Ministry on Sundays, we couldn't do what we do without our buddy team. These are the people who understand that every child needs a place where they can feel safe, secure, and loved. It is made up of women and men who have a heart for connecting with and loving on kids from foster and adoptive homes. In 2023, this team grew to 9 and we are praying that the Lord would multiply this team in the coming year as He brings us more children to love!

In the fall, one of the family Microchurches stepped up to start supporting our FAM families monthly by making freezer meals for them! This has been a huge blessing to these families. And in December, we launched our first FAM Microchurch where families who are fostering and adopting are able to attend and be with other families who get it. We are excited to see how God will move in this group in the coming year!

HIS HANDS AND FEET

It's exciting to be a part of making disciples who make disciples. In my small group alone, I saw God move in many ways! He led a child to have multiple Saturday night sleepovers and then bring her friends to church the next morning! A child at her Basketball camp told someone about Jesus when she found out the girl had never gone to church. How did she know? She asked! I saw God lead children in kindness and patience, so that even the most reluctant child will share a hurt, or idea, or question, or even play a silly game. I saw Kids do a 5k to raise money for children in Africa, kids sort over 5000 items for the elderly, kids praying powerfully for those who don't know Jesus, and a child memorizing all of Luke chapter 2 and reciting it for her friends! Something has been stirring within Youth for several years. The deep hunger among the next generation seemed to be covered by the difficulties of the present times and trials faced by our students. 2023 was a year where the Lord began to speak to every lie of shame and doubt, calling them one by one. He was personally inviting each student to see the potential and the power they carried through a relationship with Him. We watched in awe as they began to rise and find the authority already promised to them through Jesus' finished work on the cross.

The words found in Isaiah 40 came to fruition as our middle and high school students chose to fix their eyes on Jesus and hope in the Lord. "Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall, but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary; they will walk and not be faint." Amid sickness, divorce, and death, we saw more students than ever before renew their commitment and vow to Jesus and trust that their God would see them through. And He did.

One of our high school students was healed from cancer as her Green Crew and leaders prayed fervently day and night. A young man's dislocated elbow came into place as a leader prayed over him during worship. One student who suffered from crippling anxiety recalled how, after a youth retreat, they realized it was the first time in years they did not take anxiety medication and no longer felt a need to. As our Youth hoped in the Lord, we watched them soar.

Aligning with the vision to bathe everything in prayer, we launched our first prayer team that covered Wednesday service and each event in prayer. We experienced countless prophetic words that shifted the trajectory of our services. One of the most marking fruits was how our students took upon themselves the mantle of leadership from God. We saw six different bible studies begin in middle and high schools, launched by students who felt the tug of God on their souls to spread the Gospel in their schools.

At our bi-annual Youth retreats "Kairos", we saw the prophetic name come to life. Launched over 20 years ago, Kairos means "an opportune time" in Greek. Our weekend-long retreats saw this very narrative. We had recordbreaking numbers at both Kairos' retreats! Callings were given, chains were broken, and lives were saved. YOUTH TESTIMONY

HEALED FROM CANCER

"I cannot put into words just how much 2023 has changed me. I have suffered leukemia symptoms since December 27, 2022. I was admitted for kidney failure on January 10 and diagnosed with T-cell ALL Leukemia on March 31.

"The first time I was admitted I genuinely thought that it wasn't a big deal. I just spontaneously got kidney failure. I remember telling everyone, 'Let's see just how fast God can help me,' and I believed that I was going to be okay through it all. I was discharged within a week and went back to my regular scheduled life.

"Then in March, I experienced more symptoms. On the way back from getting my labs taken, I decided to stop at church, sit in the parking lot, and have a conversation with God. I asked him, 'Why is this happening to me and What did I do to deserve this?' I was upset because I felt like I had just overcome the issue. I thought that it was over. By the end of the conversation, I decided that it was better for me to just trust Him and to trust that He had a plan. So I did.

"Soon I was admitted for a bone marrow biopsy. When we got the results diagnosing me with cancer, I spent over a week coping and adjusting to the life sentence that had just been handed to me. It was truly one of the darkest moments in my life. Five days later, I was in the ICU. Things were not looking good for me. But something inside of me told me to go online and watch the youth service that was happening.

"I was healed by Him, and I am never going to let that go. I walk through every day knowing there is a God and that He will do whatever it takes for his children.

"It was during worship where one of the youth leaders had come up and felt moved to say something. He took the mic and started preaching, 'If it's not you, I want you to receive a miracle or a healing on behalf of a friend or family member. So you're now stepping in the gap for someone who can't step in themself. Someone who is getting tormented and beaten right now, we're going to step in the gap. We're going to receive miracles and healing for them right now. So Cancer in the name of Jesus, you're gone! You're gone, go on, get out, get out! White blood cells, red blood cells heal in the name of Jesus!' I started crying uncontrollably. And if you've ever been in an ICU before, you know there is no privacy whatsoever, yet I didn't care. All this time I felt unseen, and then God himself reached out to me through Gunner, through a screen, and told me I was going to be okay.

"But this wasn't the end of my miracle. I had just one more bone marrow biopsy to be discharged to see if the chemo did affect how much leukemia was in my body. I was cancer-free! A month after being diagnosed, I had no leukemia inside of me. God had never left me alone and he had every chance to. Every time I was upset or mad at him for what was happening, he was telling me I was going to be okay. I was healed by him and I am never going to let that go. I walk through every day knowing that there is a God and he will do whatever it takes for his children."

Greenhouse College took a major step in the right direction in 2023. As we prayed for God's heart and plan for college students across Gainesville, we experienced the fruition of fresh harvest, discipleship and hearts for the lost and the least, both here in Gainesville and throughout the world.

Several of our ministry's metrics soared, unprecedented and successful changes were completed and, most importantly, God transformed lives before our eyes. Our weekly attendance at the University Auditorium exploded by 49% in the fall compared to the year before, and we had the most students come to Easter since before the pandemic. A record 130 people came to College WKND in Panama City and our college microchurches ballooned to 10 groups within the ministry.

One of the mandates we feel from the Lord is to expose, equip and deploy college students to places that have limited to no access to the Gospel. This past year, we conducted our first ever College mission trip to the Arab world. Our team of 12 was moved with conviction as we saw first-hand the work God was doing with unreached people groups. Students collaborated with missionaries, shared the gospel with numerous Moroccans who had never heard it before and experienced the gravity of places with no disciples. Our students left Morocco with a revitalized heart for the lost abroad and a passion to spread the message back home.

We also revamped our internship experience this past year. We launched the college internship during Summer B, allowing students to get experience working in college ministry, launching successful microchurches in dorms and getting equipped to make disciples. Several students went on to start powerful microchurches in the fall. Additionally, we held services during summer B for the first time in the Reitz Union. Each week our staff and college interns helped conduct a full service for incoming students and those still in the area. This period was filled with dozens of special encounters with God.





This really blessed her soul when all the staff started telling her how good she looked. It made her feel so much better. My mom and son also talk with her whenever I go visit her. She likes talking with them. She is family to us. I love visiting with her and her roommates. My mom has so many devotionals she gets in the mail. So she sends them, by me, to give to the ladies. It has been a pleasure being her faithful friend."





2023 was a year of transition for Breakthrough Weekend. Pastor Renee Handtke moved into a new role, empowering and equipping Julia Pagan, Janine Johnson, and Christine Sepulveda to lead this life-transforming ministry. As a result, the Breakthrough Team focused on building on the foundation with new innovation.

The vision of Breakthrough is to see ordinary people saved, freed and delivered to then go and make disciples. This past year we honed in on the idea of "go and make disciples" through two new initiatives: the Journey to Wholeness Microchurch and implementation of the Discipleship Pathway.

The Journey to Wholeness Microchurch is a six-week, short term Microchurch that immediately follows Breakthrough Weekend and focuses on continuing the journey of healing that started during Breakthrough. Dozens of participants and servers attended this Microchurch, coming out connected, rejuvenated, and refreshed with a deeper connection to the Vine.

Additionally, we made it a point to get all of our servers and participants signed up for Greenhouse's Discipleship Pathway, helping them take the next step in their discipleship journey.
