**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

**DEAR CHURCH FAMILY,**

*Each year, as we pause to reflect, I'm reminded that we are part of something far bigger than ourselves. We are ordinary people, yes – but we serve an extraordinary God who loves to do what only He can do. And 2025 was one of those years where His hand was unmistakable.*

This year, the Lord invited us into a step of faith that will ripple for generations. Through a series of events we could never have orchestrated, 115 acres of land became available. We weren't looking for land, but it became clear the Lord was inviting us to follow His lead. In just a few short weeks, we moved from praying and fasting to sharing and giving. At the same time, God has been strengthening the foundation beneath everything we do. We have remained focused on the call to become a House of Prayer. This calling is not first about buildings or campuses – it's about who we are becoming. A House of Prayer is a posture of the heart. It's a people learning to live under the leadership of Jesus. It's a growing hunger to linger in His presence, to listen before we act, and to allow prayer to shape our decisions, our ministries, and our daily lives.

Throughout this year, we've seen lives changed, disciples formed, and ministries strengthened. We've watched faith rise in the middle of challenge and generosity flourish in uncertain times. Once again, God has shown us that when we seek Him first, He is faithful to carry what we cannot.

With so much to celebrate, we also know we will always be a people who are seeking. We move forward with hope – asking the Lord for wisdom, clarity, and courage for what's next. We don't want

to run ahead of Him or lag behind. Our desire is simple: to follow closely, to obey quickly, and to trust deeply.

Thank you for loving God, living on mission, and giving yourself to His community. As you read this report, I pray that God stirs fresh faith into your heart as He has in mine.

# 115 ACRES THAT EMBODY THE VISION OF GREENHOUSE CHURCH

**W**hen we opened the doors to our new facility in 2018, we stepped into that season with faith, not fully knowing how God intended to use the space. We sensed a call to go from Gainesville to the Nations, believing that here the lost would meet Jesus, disciples would be formed, and leaders would be sent.

From that first Sunday, a commitment to give sacrificially marked our church. We gave in faith to missions, church planting, and the poor – and God has honored our efforts. Over time, our geographical footprint expanded, and what began with 40-plus acres for the initial property eventually grew to include additional wooded acreage behind the church.

Then, in 2025, God opened another door.

After a season of prayer and fasting, and with unanimous affirmation from our elders, deacons, and trustees, we sensed a clear and urgent leading to not miss what God was doing while He was doing it. An extraordinary opportunity emerged to acquire 114.8 acres of rolling pastureland just north of our

current property. In faith, and over the course of less than 90 days, the church stepped forward and completed the purchase debt-free!

Acts 15 speaks of the Lord rebuilding the “tabernacle of David” so that “the rest of mankind may seek Him.” We believe this land represents a tangible invitation to participate in that present-day work – creating space where the presence of God is prioritized and where people can seek Him.

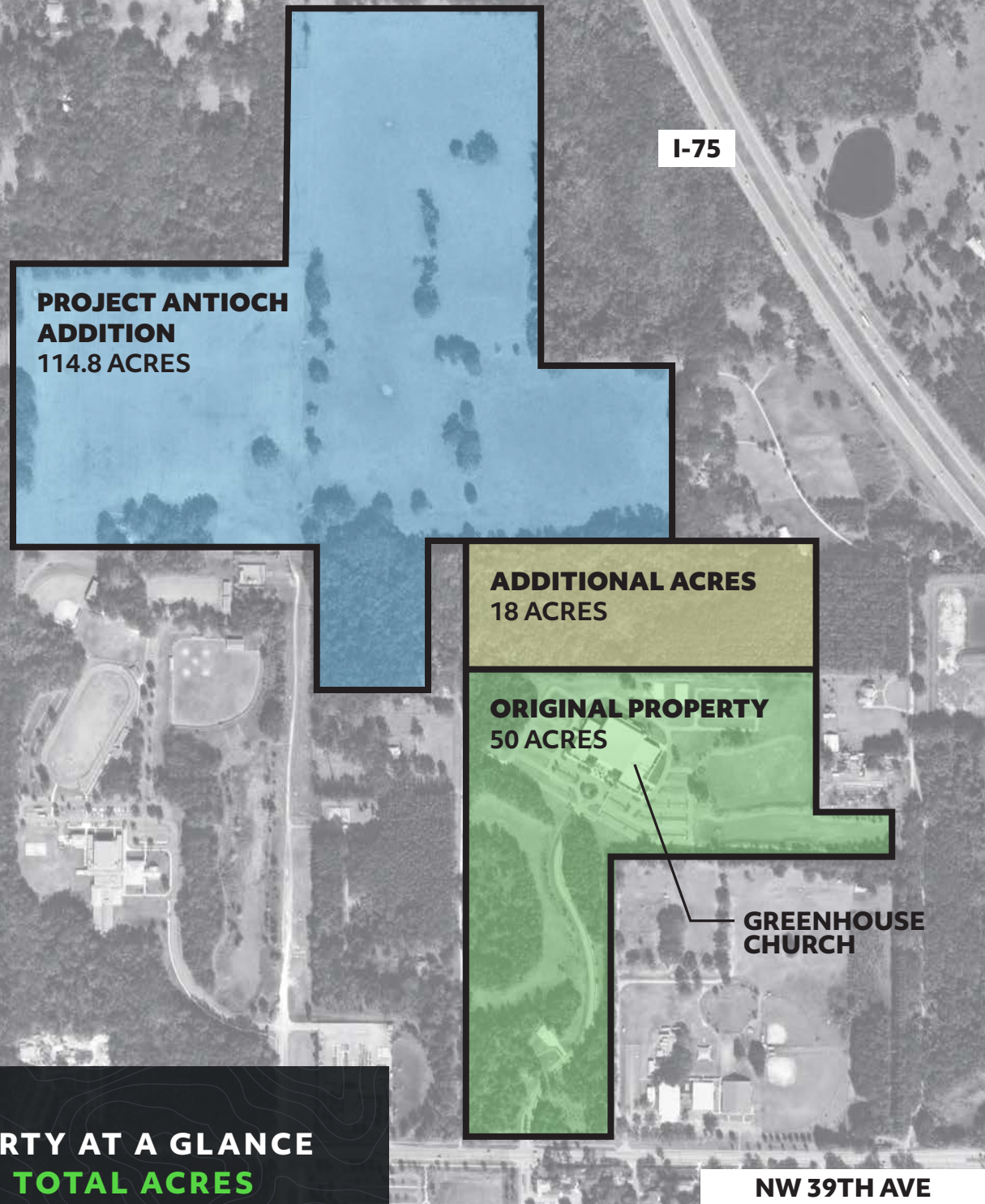
The land itself serves as a tangible sign of God’s provision and care in four core areas that have shaped our vision from the very beginning: Prayer, The Poor, Harvest, and Leadership.

This acquisition does not replace or diminish our current ministries. Rather, it expands our capacity to pursue the mission God has already entrusted to us.

We are deeply grateful for the faith, generosity, and prayer of this church family. Your willingness to seek the Lord, to give sacrificially, and to step forward in unity made this possible. Now, as the land has been secured, we continue seeking God for wisdom regarding its development.

## THE FOUR PILLARS

Now that the land has been secured, we continue seeking God for wisdom regarding its development. We do not want to run ahead of Him, nor lag behind. We believe the same God who opened this door will faithfully guide every next step.

### 1 PRAYER

We long for the tabernacle of David to be rebuilt in people’s hearts as they pursue the Lord on this property. This vision is to create spaces dedicated to prayer, such as a prayer chapel or individual prayer rooms, where people will encounter God.

### 2 THE POOR

This land presents an opportunity to practically care for “the widow, the orphan, the homeless, the abused, the broken, and the abandoned.” One way we hope to do this is by using the property to grow crops that can be used to feed those in need.

### 3 HARVEST

With our ministries growing rapidly – especially those for children and youth – this land will provide the additional space we urgently need. It will also enable us to improve the flow of traffic in and out of the property, resolving current logistical challenges.

### 4 LEADERSHIP

This property will serve as a central hub for our operations and church planting initiatives, and as a place of restoration for leaders. Plans include offering housing for missionaries returning from the field, giving them a space to rest and recover.

through intentional, gospel-centered outreach that honored human dignity.

Educational gaps were addressed through partnerships with several local schools.

Children and adults rescued from trafficking received restoration through strategic partnerships with national and international ministries committed to ending human trafficking.

Vulnerable men and women in our city were loved and supported through ministry in correctional facilities, outreach to people experiencing homelessness, collaboration with food banks, and providing safety and housing for victims and families affected by abuse and violence.

Recently incarcerated individuals received scholarships and opportunities to further their education, greatly decreasing their chances of recidivism through our partnership with the Santa Fe College Freedom to Learn initiative.

Immigrant and refugee communities were welcomed, honored and cared for holistically.

Churches were planted and strengthened among people groups with little or no gospel access.

The persecuted and suffering global church was upheld in prayer and tangibly supported and protected.

Widows, orphans and foster families received practical resources, care and ongoing support. In 2025, Greenhouse gave more to missions, to our city and to the poor than ever before. We also sent out new missionaries from our congregation who are serving on the frontlines of missions among unreached peoples. We celebrate each of them and continue to pray that 100 of our own would be sent to plant churches and make disciples among all nations.

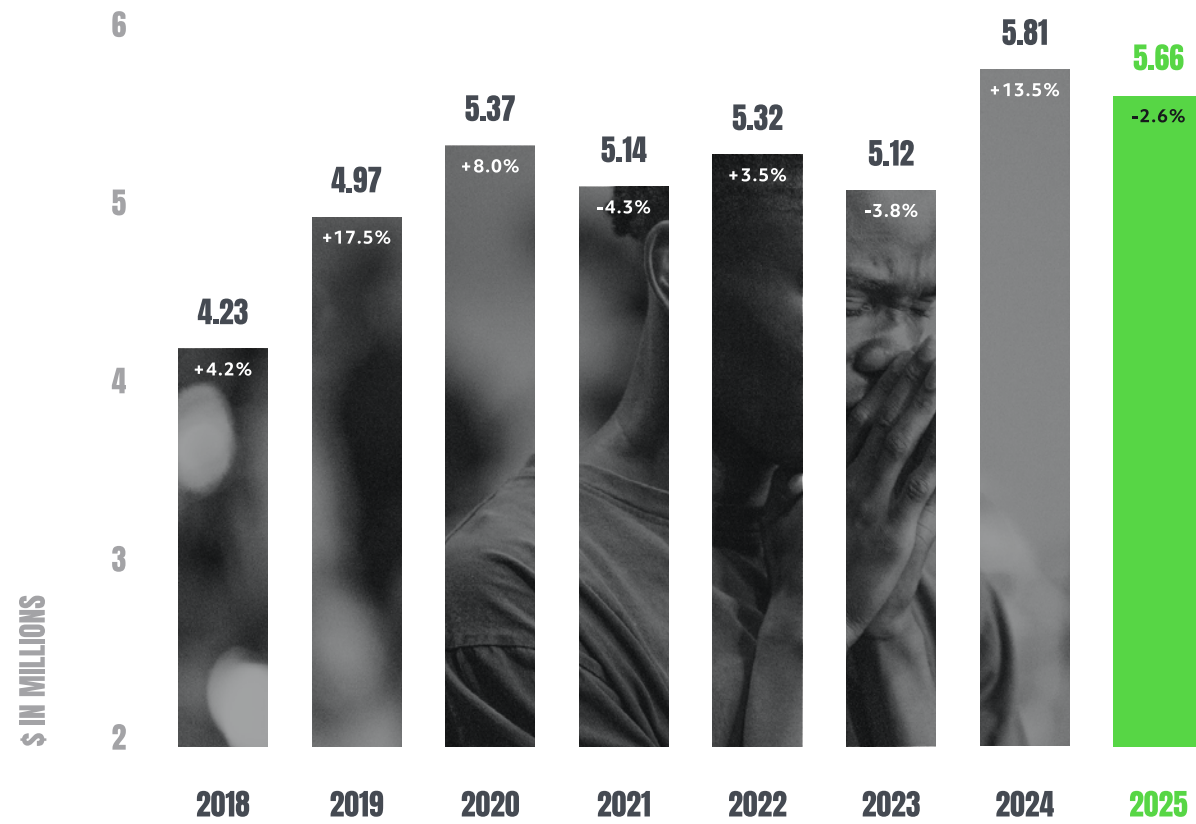

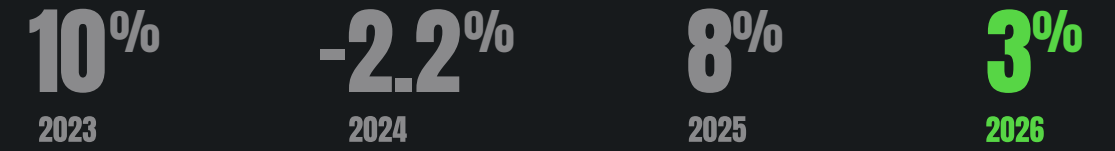

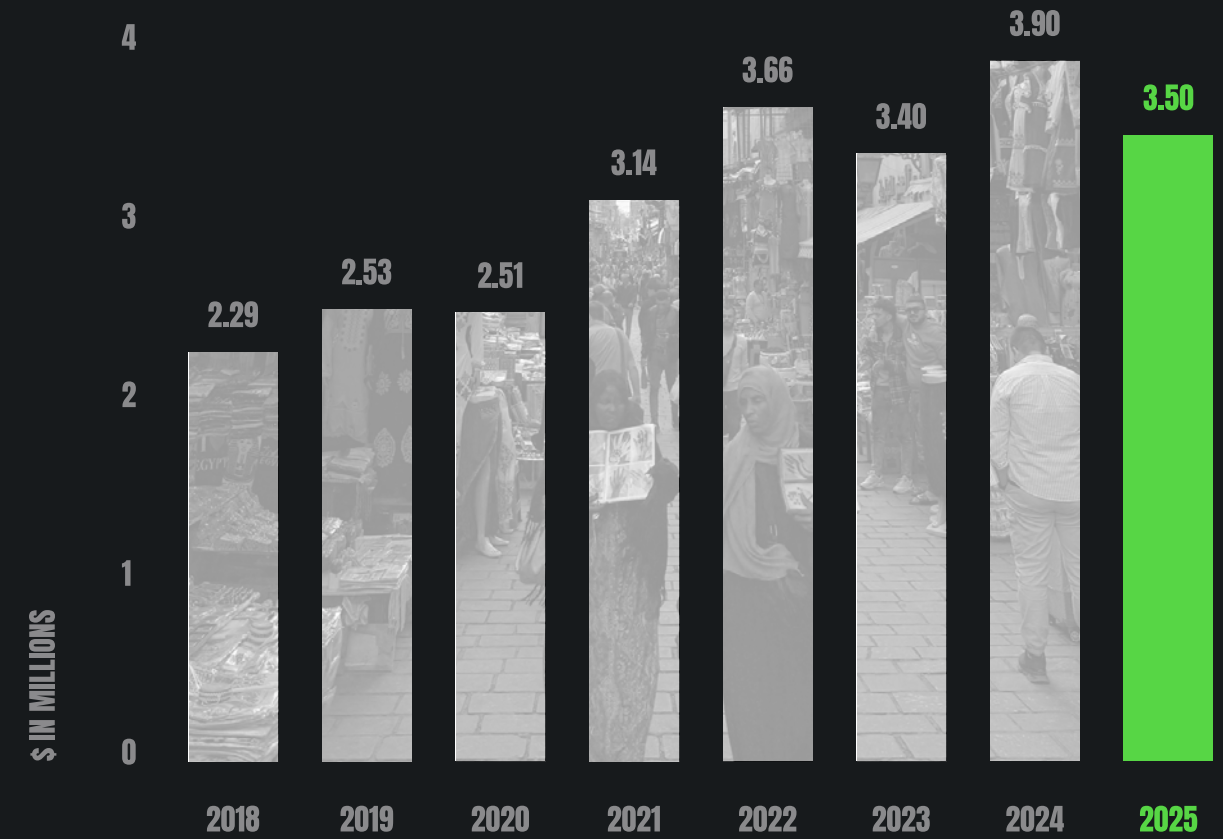

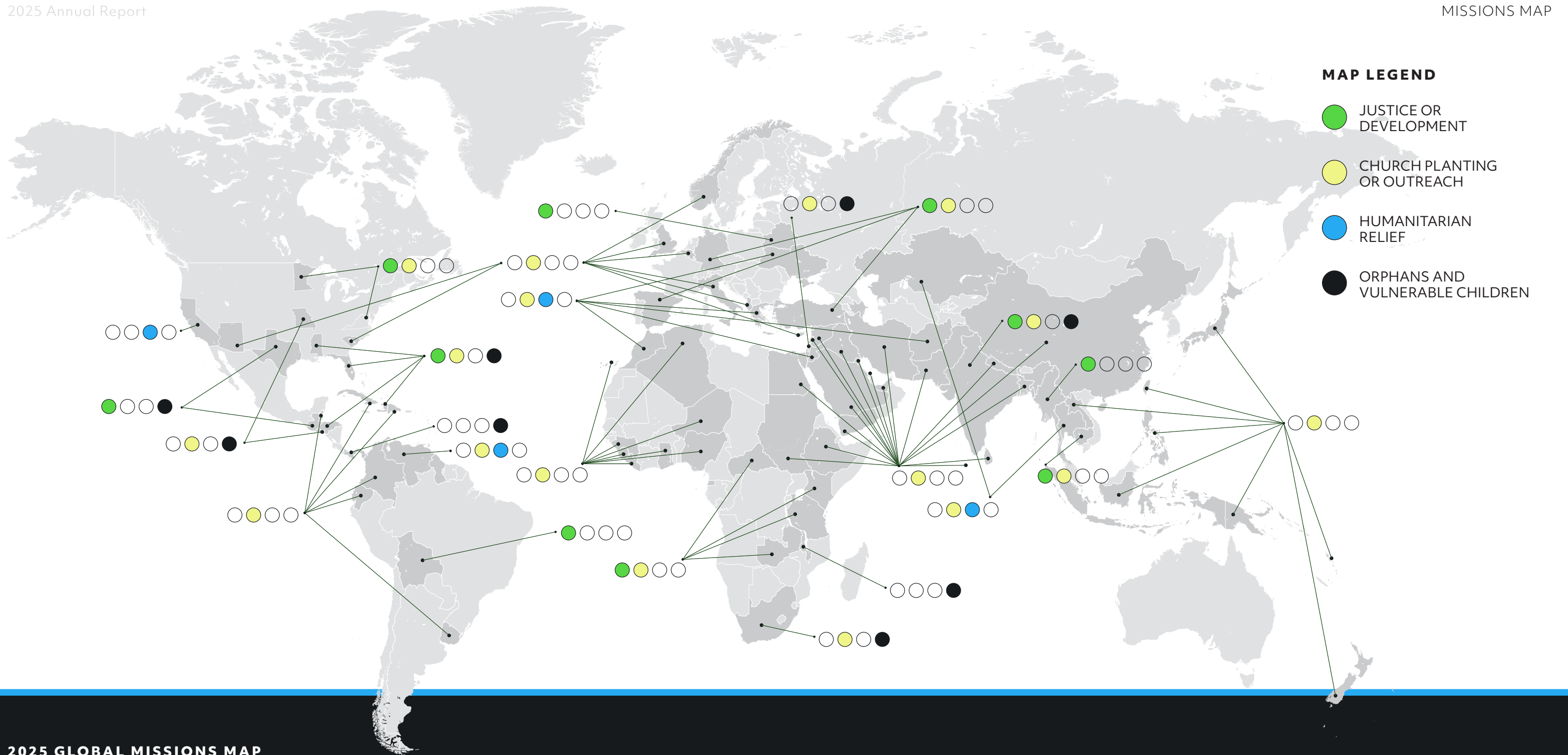

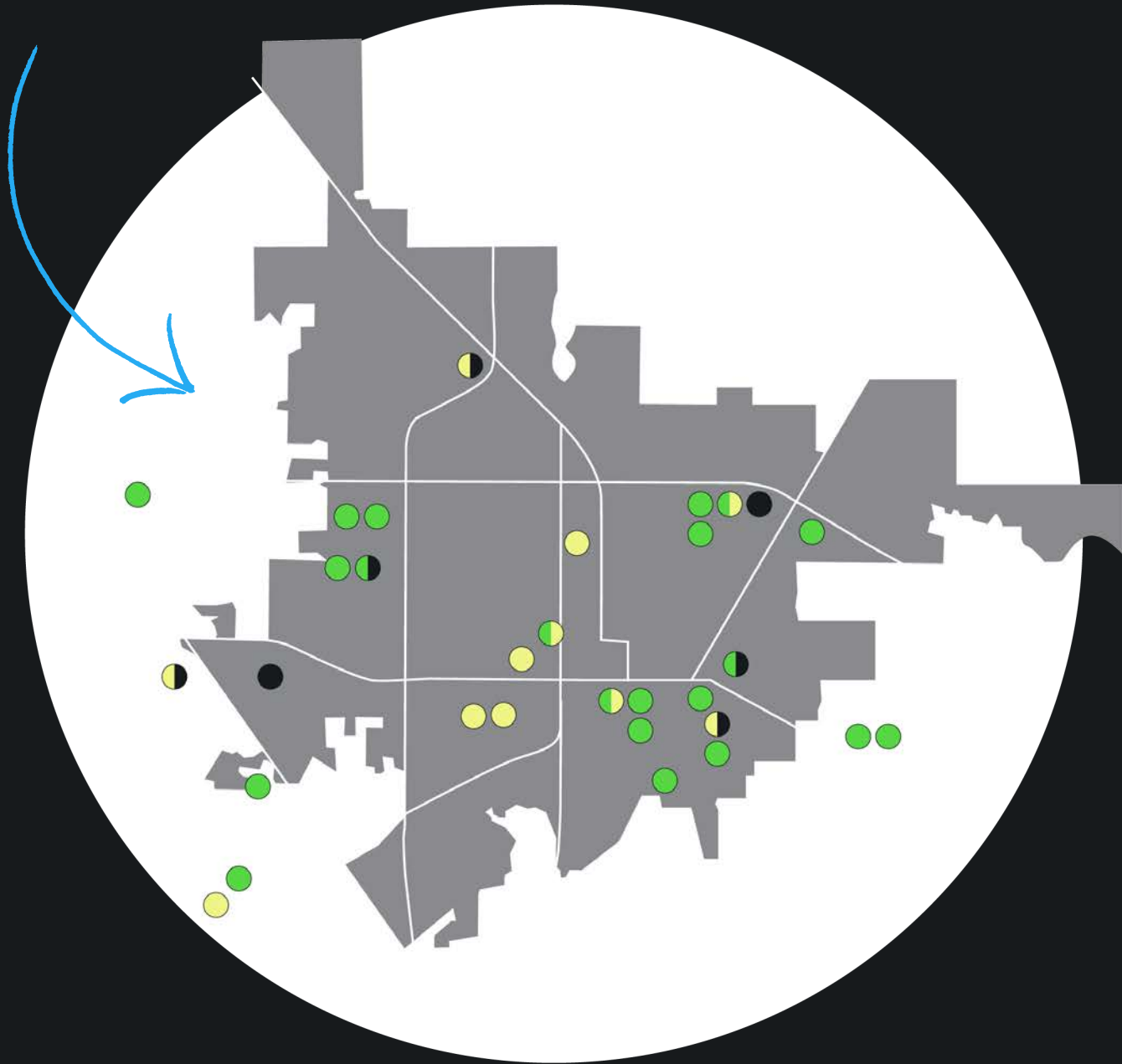

# NEIGHBORHOOD PARTNERSHIPS

At Greenhouse, loving our city means showing up consistently in the places we've been called to serve. Through long-standing partnerships in Carver Gardens, Holly Heights, and Pineridge, we are committed to building relationships, meeting needs, and pointing neighbors to Jesus. Each community is different, but the heartbeat is the same: faithful presence, practical support, and Gospel-centered hope. 2025 saw growth, transition, and deepened connection – all evidence of God's work through ordinary obedience.

**CARVER GARDENS**

Expansion defined 2025. This year marked significant growth for our tutoring program as our team nearly doubled, welcoming close to 10 dedicated tutors. This allowed us to serve students who had remained on our waiting list for over a year, moving us closer to our capacity goal of 20 students. This expansion strengthened our ability to build meaningful relationships with new families and those who have journeyed with us for years.

Academically, this year also strengthened the quality and effectiveness of our program. As our Program Director pursued a graduate certificate in Early Childhood Education, our program benefited directly from advanced training and research-based strategies. Through updated professional team development and strengthened progress monitoring in collaboration with UF's College of Education, we improved our ability to support students in reaching grade-level benchmarks and key academic milestones.



Most importantly, our mission to help students achieve academic success while pointing them to Christ became even more intentional. We have seen students hide God's Word in their hearts with genuine excitement, particularly as Scripture memorization was integrated into our literacy challenges. Watching our students grow in both confidence and faith has been one of the year's greatest joys.

Our annual Easter celebration in partnership with the Carver Gardens community also grew in intentionality and impact. We created a dedicated space for parents and adults for the first time. Through games, fellowship, and meaningful connection, families felt seen, valued, and deeply cherished. The joy experienced that day reflected the strength and beauty of authentic community.

We are grateful for the opportunity to continue helping bridge the academic gap and to walk alongside families as their children thrive in 2026.



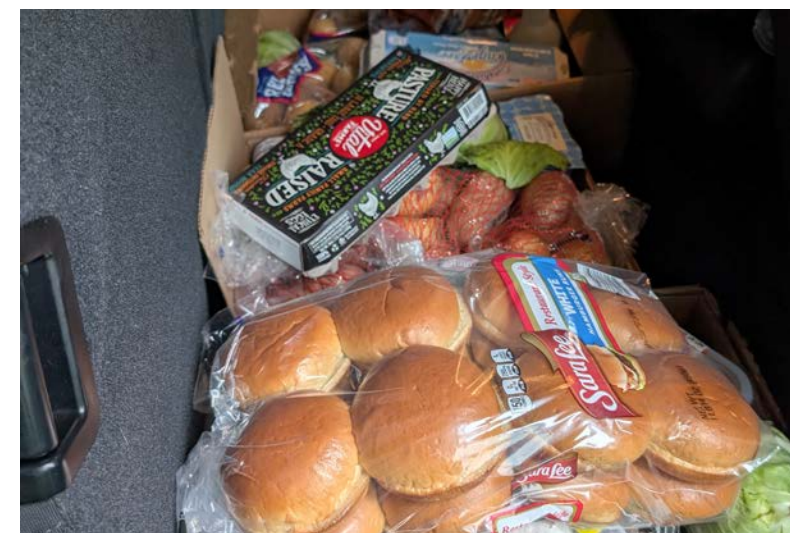
**HOLLY HEIGHTS**

Over the past year, our ministry has involved more than 400 hours of volunteer work in the Holly Heights area of Gainesville.

Each week, we purchase discounted food in bulk from the Bread of the Mighty Food Bank, including frozen meat, eggs, bread, canned goods, toiletries, and fresh produce. We then repackage these items into individualized boxes and deliver them to 12-15 households, serving 30-40 individuals and providing weekly groceries to supplement their needs. In 2025, the total food distributed amounted to approximately 16,000 pounds!

Our ministry reaches a diverse range of individuals, including home-bound seniors, people with disabilities, veterans, and low-wage workers with children – all facing financial hardship.

This year, we were especially touched by one individual who has benefited from this ministry



since 2020. After moving to a more stable environment, he began volunteering at the Food Bank as a way to thank the Lord for the blessings he had received and to help others as he had been helped.

This ministry is not just about logistics; it is a tangible expression of following Jesus, ensuring that the least of us in our community are seen, loved, and supported by this congregation. Please pray for us, as the need is great and the number of laborers is few.

In Matthew 25:35, Jesus said, "For I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat; I was thirsty, and you gave me something to drink; I was a stranger and you invited me in."

And in Matthew 25:40, "...to the extent that you did it for one of these brothers of mine, even the least of them, you did it for me." We are grateful to serve this unseen people group.

**PINERIDGE**

2025 was a year of transition for our Pineridge ministry teams. In the midst of the transition, we experienced deeper connections with families, growing volunteer teams, engaging activities for kids to enjoy, holiday events, and our weekly tutoring and kids church meetings. We continue to see growth and fruit from the deep roots planted in Pineridge for the past 25 years.

**Kids Church**

From the beginning, our prayer has been for volunteers to have a heart for lifelong serving in their communities. In 2025, one of our volunteers started an organization called Equip 352, which helps UF students partner with Pineridge and other local community groups. Due to this connection, our kids church team has grown. And as kids church is entering into its eighth year, we are amazed at the realization that some of our kids have attended for most of their lives. We are deeply grateful for every door the Lord has opened and kept open throughout this time, and we continue to pray His will be done in this community.

This year we saw two middle school students get baptized. Thanks to Addison Staples and Fausto Morales for stepping up to faithfully drive the van to and from Greenhouse Youth every Wednesday so our middle schoolers have the chance to experience the love of Jesus.

**Tutoring**

In 2025, our tutoring program relocated to a building on the Greenhouse NW campus, and it has been such a blessing! We serve the same students and families, but we now have a larger space, full of possibilities, to make our own.

This year we also felt God's faithfulness in some small program improvements that have made a big difference. We connected with a learning specialist at a local school who provided guidance on expanding our literacy program. 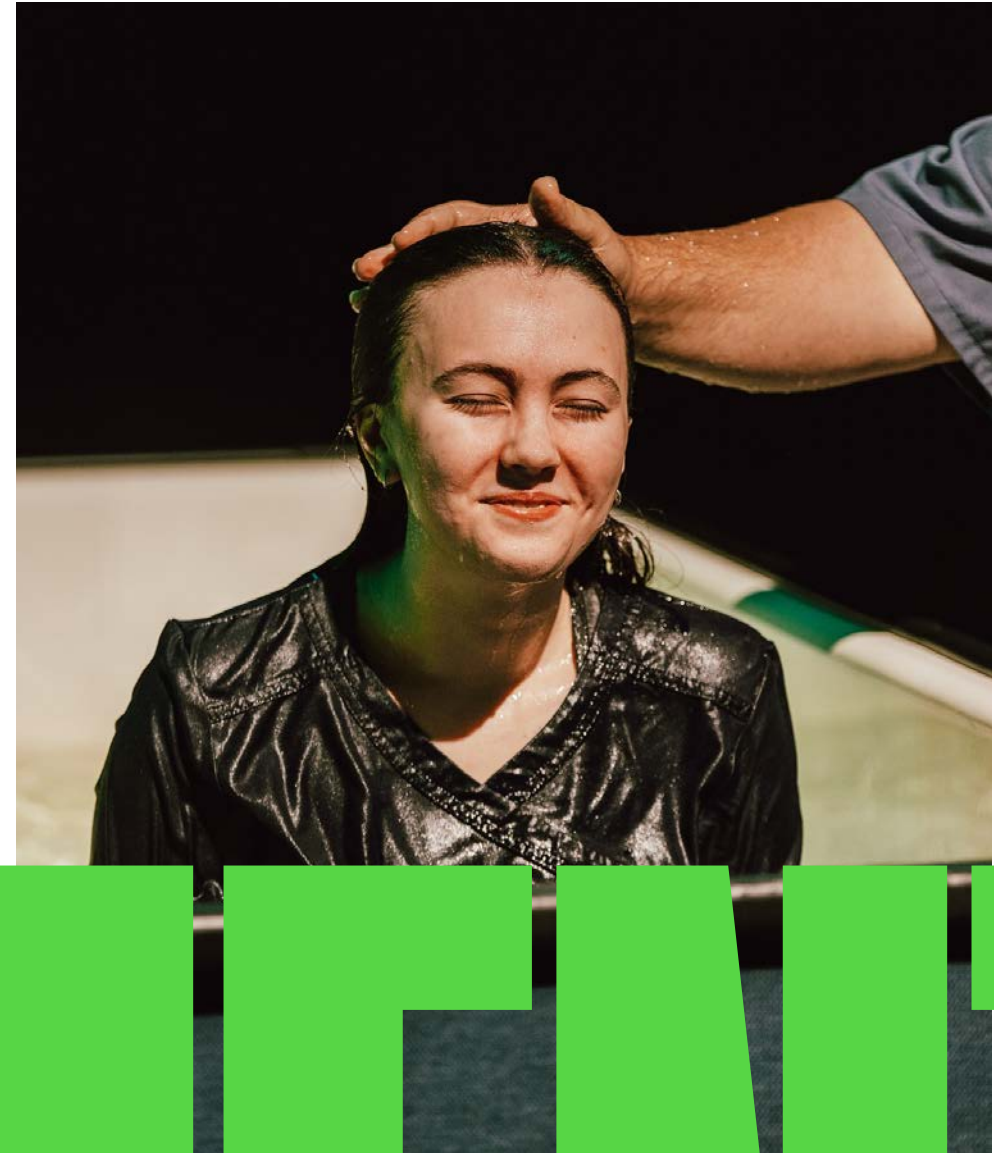

# ORLANDO

*Every church plant begins with a step of faith, and in 2024, Christine and Kelly Sepulveda sensed God leading them to move from Tampa to start something new in Orlando. After a season marked by prayer, fasting, discernment, and affirmation from leadership, they stepped out, and, in June 2025, relocated to Orlando with their daughter – trusting the Lord with what was ahead.*

On June 22, Greenhouse Orlando gathered for its very first Sunday service in the Sepulveda home – nine adults and two children filling a living room with worship, hope, and expectancy. It was a sacred morning, marked by joy and a tangible sense that God was beginning something new in the city.

In the weeks that followed, the fruit of obedience became evident. The church celebrated its first baptism, followed soon after by a second and third. As new faces joined, Pastor Christine often described it as “the right people at the right time.”

What began as a small group of strangers steadily became a spiritual family—sharing meals, stories, prayers, and mission together.

Two microchurches launched, and Greenhouse Orlando grew to approximately 40 adults and seven children, eventually reaching capacity in the Sepulveda home. What God was forming was more than a weekly gathering; it was a community rooted in discipleship, love, and shared life through the good, the hard, and everything in between.



As growth continued, Pastor Christine began prayerfully searching for a space to support the next phase of the church plant. Through a series of providential connections, Greenhouse Orlando was introduced to former church planters stewarding a beautiful church facility in downtown Orlando – H2O Church. The location was central, strategic, and aligned with the vision to serve the wider Metro Orlando area.

Greenhouse Orlando began gathering in this new space in February 2026, with spring Microchurches and Discipleship Training launching shortly after. The heart remains clear: to build a strong, healthy foundation of discipleship while seeking to saturate the city with disciples who make disciples. We are deeply grateful for the mercy of Jesus and His perfect timing every step of the way.

As we step into 2026, we are praying and believing for continued growth, depth, and multiplication. By the end of the spring, we hope to see Greenhouse Orlando grow to 50+ people and multiply into two additional microchurches, all while remaining anchored in worship, mission, and community.

We are dreaming boldly for lives transformed, leaders raised up, and neighborhoods impacted by the love of Jesus. With joy, faith, and expectation, we look ahead trusting that God is not finished – and that the best is yet to come, all for His glory.

*From microchurch baptisms in inflatable pools to pivoting to three different Sunday gathering spaces, 2025 was a year of change and spiritual growth for Greenhouse Jacksonville.*

A year that saw major transitions was coupled with a consistency from the grace of God on this church plant that somehow managed to not only sustain us, but to overwhelm us with His goodness. This pairing has given us such a renewed hope for 2026.

The greatest challenge we faced in 2025 was also the catalyst for our greatest faith. With only 48 hours notice, a new company assumed control of Duval County Public School partnerships and resulted in a tripling of our monthly rent. July 2025 was a critical moment for our church, and as the Lord has from the beginning, He reminded us again of his promise in Psalm 127: "Unless the Lord builds the house, the people labor in vain."

We are thankful and confident that though this work has been unclear at times, His Hand has not been. The greatest win in 2025 came at the literal buzzer for our church family. December was the deadline for our church to find a new Sunday home, as we could not continue handling the dramatic increase of rent. On the final day of our existing contract, the Lord opened a door we had been praying for for four months!

Our new venue isn't just suitable – it surpasses everything we had hoped for, providing even greater space for the future. Not only did the door to open, but the opportunities for ministry and missions impact came with it. We're now at the Schultz Center, a facility for the enrichment and growth of both local educators and students needing additional assistance. And now our rent not only opens a door for us to continue helping ordinary people become passionate followers of Jesus, but those dollars now get to turn around and pour into the increase of leadership and excellence for the educators of our city.

This past year ended the way it began. God is for us, and as we abide in this truth, we are so expectant that the Lord is about to do even greater through us, until Jacksonville looks like Heaven.

# HOUSE OF PRAYER

2025 was a year of deepening roots. We witnessed a beautiful shift as our church family moved from hurried prayer to unhurried presence. Our prayer initiatives brought fresh energy to our mission to seek justice and contend for revival.

Over 300 volunteers committed to our weekly prayer teams, covering our ministries and leadership in intercession.

The House of Prayer expanded to the University of Florida campus, meeting Monday mornings at the Reitz Union to pray for students and faculty.

50 dedicated intercessors devoted hundreds of hours to praying specifically for seven Florida cities: Tallahassee, Pensacola, Orlando, Fort Pierce, Fort Myers, Spring Hill, and Miami.

Every Sunday, team members prayed through every service, contending for the hearts of every person who walked through our doors.

The results of this persistent prayer have been staggering. In 2025, we saw strongholds broken, lives restored, and hearts awakened. The ripple effect of these hours reached far beyond our walls, bringing healing and salvation into neighborhoods and homes across our community.

We are deeply grateful for those who labor in prayer. As we look back on a year of God's faithfulness, we look ahead with expectancy, believing He is leading us into even greater measures of His presence and power.

*Making disciples of children will always feel like one of the most humbling things we get to do with the Lord. There is something about hearing a child pray real prayers, forgive a real hurt, or ask Jesus to come close that reminds you God truly delights in revealing Himself to the small and the sincere.*

We saw kids come carrying fear, anxiety, family tension, loneliness – and we watched the Lord meet them gently. Some of the sweetest moments this year weren’t during the lesson, but in small prayer circles where kids were comforting one another and inviting Jesus in. The Lord has been kind to let us witness hearts opening.

***Raising up a House of Prayer Generation***

Throughout 2025, our Sunday gatherings shifted. We didn’t just teach kids how to pray – we watched them become people who pray.

There were weeks where worship lingered because kids didn’t want to stop talking to God. Friends prayed for headaches, bad dreams, family members, school situations, and courage. We heard testimonies of pain leaving, peace returning, and kids choosing forgiveness when they previously couldn’t. It has been deeply moving to watch children realize that they have full access to God. Not someday when they are older, but right now.

We believe the Lord is teaching them early that His presence is not far away and that His voice is not only for adults.

The Lord is doing a healing work in the lives of our kids. We see Him forming sensitivity to His voice, boldness in prayer, and courage to make different choices. They are learning early how to guard their hearts and stay close to Him. We believe He is preparing them to carry His presence wherever they go: homes, schools, friendships, and families.

As we step into 2026, we hold onto this promise: “The One who calls you is faithful, and He will do it.” 1 Thessalonians 5:24

Thank you for praying with us and believing with us. We are expectant for what doors the Lord will continue to open and what doors He will gently close as our kids walk with Him. Amen.



**KIDS CAMP**

in summer 2025, we hosted our fourth annual Kids Camp with a clear focus: Jesus is the Door, and we get to choose what we allow into our lives. Throughout the week, 164 kids and 75 leaders practiced opening their hearts to Jesus and closing doors to distractions, lies, and sin that pull them away from Him.

Every day, they stepped into Kids Discipleship Trainings (KDTs), where they practiced following Jesus – not just learning about Him. Kids started to see that God designed them with purpose and that they can serve Him right now. Some learned to lead and encourage others. Some served behind the scenes. Some created, solved problems, built things, helped friends, and discovered that they love caring for people. We continue hearing stories from families about what changed after camp.



**FAMILY SERVICE**

We concluded camp with a Family Service celebrating all that the Lord had done. Kids showed their families all they learned throughout camp and operated in their APEST gifts. This included cooking & baking, STEM, sports, acting, and art. It was beautiful. We love Family Service, because it is a time where we see a church made up of all ages – from babies to grandparents – worshiping together. This is the Church. One body. One Sound. Lifting high the only One worthy to be praised!

**BAPTISMS & DEDICATIONS**

This year we celebrated 13 baptisms – kids choosing to publicly follow Jesus and step into new life. We also dedicated eight children to the Lord, special moments where families commit to their homes being centered around Jesus, and the church commits to walking alongside them. It’s a beautiful reminder that discipleship begins in households and grows in community.

# FOSTER & ADOPTION

*This year continued to remind us that FAM is not just a ministry we run, it's a way our church lives out the heart of God. Caring for foster and adoptive families asks ordinary people to say yes to extraordinary moments, often without warning and rarely with full preparation. And yet, throughout 2025, we watched families in our church keep opening their homes and their lives anyway.*

Right now, 30 foster and adoptive families in our church are actively caring for children who need stability, patience, and consistent love. Much of what they do happens quietly; late night conversations, new routines, hard transitions, and the slow rebuilding of trust. These families are not just providing housing; they are helping children experience safety and belonging in a way that reflects the love of God. It has been humbling to walk alongside them and see the faithfulness required in everyday moments.

Our Buddy Team continued to play an important

role this year as well. With 5 volunteers serving consistently, they helped make sure children with additional needs could fully participate in church life. They sat beside kids during lessons, helped them engage, and created a sense of comfort in an environment that can sometimes feel overwhelming. What seems small from the outside often means everything to a child being noticed, being understood, and being included. These leaders helped make church a place where kids could relax enough to actually receive.

We also saw 5 microchurches step in to support families in practical ways. Meals were delivered during difficult weeks, projects were completed around homes, and families were covered in prayer. Foster care was never meant to be carried alone, and this year we watched the community take shape around families who needed reinforcement. Many parents shared that simply knowing people were consistently thinking of them and showing up changed how supported they felt.

One of our favorite parts of the year was gathering families together. We hosted five FAM events; FAM Picture Day, Parents Day Out, Mom's Brunch, and two FAM Sundays. Each one gave families space to breathe. Parents were encouraged, kids got to play without pressure, and our church had the chance to celebrate and pray over them. These moments reminded families that they are not just serving the church, they are being carried by it too.

As we continue forward, we sense the Lord shaping a deeper calling in our church. This ministry isn't

only about meeting needs; it is about becoming the kind of people who move toward vulnerability rather than away from it. We are grateful for every family, volunteer, and microchurch that has stepped in, and we are expectant for how God will continue to grow compassion and endurance in us as a body. Please continue praying that our church would remain a place where children and families experience stability, support, and the love of Jesus through His people.

# YOUTH

*2025 was a year of discovering just how good our Shepherd truly is. It was marked by growth – not only in numbers, but in depth, unity, and spiritual maturity. Early in the year, our leaders sensed a clear vision: trust the Good Shepherd and follow where He leads. What unfolded was Spirit-led, steady, and deeply meaningful.*

Our 29 Youth leaders faithfully embraced the call to shepherd our students. Historically, the spring semester brings decline as seniors shift toward sports, college, and new life transitions. In past years, graduating classes averaged 20–25 students. But this year was different.

This class represented something beautiful and unique. Some students had only recently started attending Greenhouse and had just begun following Jesus. Others had grown up in Sprouts, Kids, and Youth – an entire generation formed in a culture of seeking the Lord during their most formative years.

As graduation approached, our seniors sought the Lord for clarity like never before, praying over college decisions, jobs, and next steps. The fruit was tangible peace. For those remaining in Youth, callings were confirmed in fresh and exciting ways.

Nearly 30 students served on mission during summer, traveling to El Salvador and Jackson, Mississippi.

In El Salvador, several students and leaders sensed a call to global missions and have continued to steward that calling faithfully. In Jackson, students encountered God's heart for racial reconciliation and justice. Through learning, listening, and meaningful conversations, they left anchored in Christ's love and compelled by Micah 6:8: to do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God.

Another defining moment of the year came at Kairos retreat in Vero Beach, where over 200 students gathered for a weekend marked by peace and joy. During one worship session, students were invited to receive prayer for father wounds and family hurts. What followed was powerful. A simple camp room became a place of deep healing and restoration. Students experienced the Father's love in tangible ways, and the atmosphere shifted.

Greenhouse YTH continues to exist to help ordinary teenagers become passionate followers of Jesus Christ because of the faithfulness of our church. 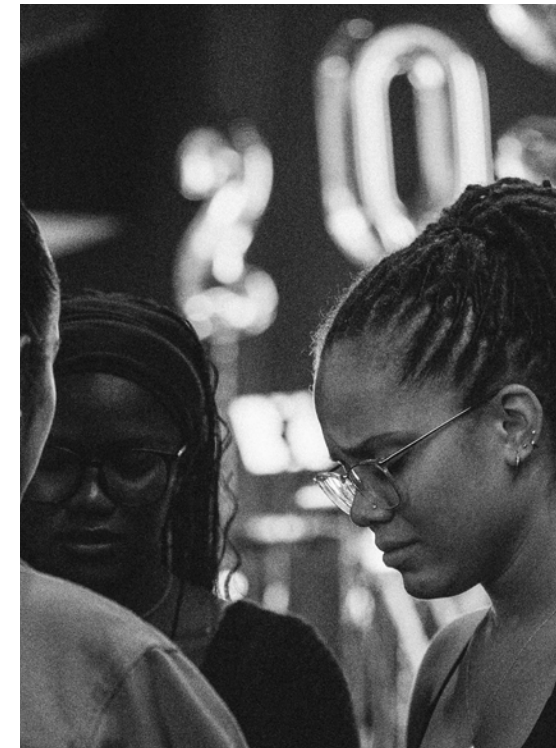
Transformation is happening. Wholeness is taking root. Students are encountering Jesus.

**COLLEGE**

*2025 was a year of renewed focus and meaningful growth for Greenhouse College – a year marked by deeper reorientation around Jesus and a clearer sense of mission.*

On Sunday nights, more than 300 students gathered consistently, coming expectant, encountering the gospel, and stepping into authentic community. Throughout the week, Greenhouse College expanded to 16 microchurches across Gainesville, reaching students at UF and Santa Fe. In these smaller communities, students built deep, life-giving friendships while growing in discipleship, mission, and confidence in the Word of God.

Our missional heartbeat extended far beyond campus. Two global trips to Morocco and Egypt stretched students beyond their comfort zones and mobilized them in powerful evangelistic moments. These experiences ignited a greater vision for God’s work among the nations and stirred long-term calling.

One of the fall highlights was our annual College WKND in Vero Beach. Participation increased by 34% from the previous year, with 175 students gathering for a powerful weekend of vision from Pastor Mike, equipping from missionaries, and strengthening a joyful, Jesus-centered community. Several students were baptized, said yes to the nations, and took meaningful steps forward in their discipleship journey.

*OASIS exists to remind us of a Kingdom truth our culture often forgets: purpose never retires. Not in the Kingdom of God and not among the older adults of Greenhouse Church. Like Simeon and Anna, our seasoned saints continue to burn with devotion, carrying wisdom and spiritual authority formed over decades of walking with God. The Kingdom does not sideline faithfulness.
